I was born in Sin Feb. 1716


Remained ignorant of my fallen State till 1730

Lived proudly on Faith & Works for Salvation till 1754

Admitted to Everton Vicarage 1755 .

Fled to JESUS alone for Refuge 1756 .

Fell asleep in Christ Jan^r. 22^d. 1793 .
